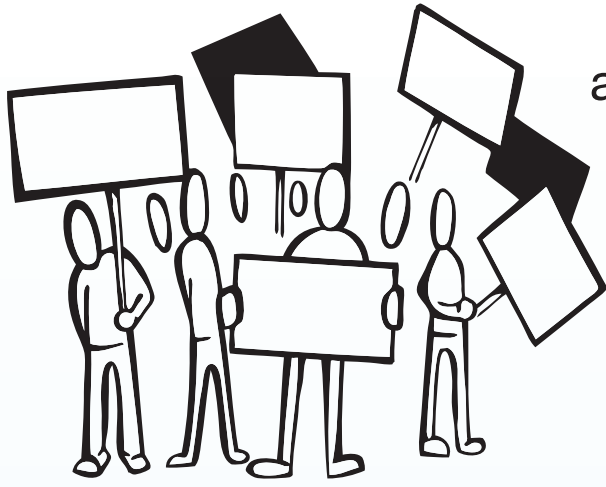


All actions have consequences. Here is just one illustration of one food choice that depicts the result when we do not have a variety of farming methods:

But then,

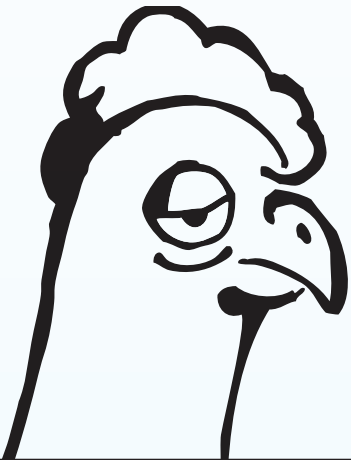
a vocal minority thought everyone should eat like they eat.
